The phrase after the gap provides a negative meaning and emphasizes the affordability problem with the adjective enormous. This means that the problem of enormous affordability needs to be overcome. The word in the options that has the meaning of overcoming and eliminating is given in option C.

2. When we look at the second gap, the word motivate is always followed by the preposition by. This helps us eliminate options C and D. In the first gap the word bristle is followed by the preposition with. Therefore, option A is the correct answer.

This indicates that the first part of the statement requires the modal should in the past form and the second part needs to be in the present form because of the word "now".
